CHIEF'S REPORT

AUGUST, 2019

Operations and Activities

During the month of August, 2019, Victor Fire Department responded to 37 calls, including:

- 4 fires (1 structure, 1 brush, 2 outside/ equipment fires)
- 3 motor vehicle collisions/ rescue
- 5 EMS calls
- 4 hazardous conditions
- 4 good intent/ service calls
- 9 false alarms
- 8 mutual aid: 3 to Farmington, 1 to Egypt, 4 to Fishers.

We received mutual aid on 8 calls (8 Fishers, 1 Egypt).

The average attendance per call was 8.6 firefighters (4.9 average on scene), providing a total of **245** hours of service. We had a Victor Fire unit on scene within 5 minutes at 43% of the calls and within 9 minutes at 73%.

There were 8 training events totaling **168** hours of service; 4 were department wide, averaging 15.3 firefighters.

In addition, there were 24 other events (meetings, parades, work details, etc.), where our members provided an additional **350** hours of service. All told, our members have provided **763 hours of service** this past month.

- Work with Service techs for generator repairs, Empire Access (phone switchover)

Throughout the month, our members participated in the Farmington Carnival Parade, provided fire police assistance during the parade, and a fireworks standby crew with Farmington. In addition, we had a crew at the National Night Out event, held an open house/ volunteer recruitment night, and held a family spaghetti night for our members and their families.

With the change of vendors for the phone system, our alarm system is experiencing trouble, as we do not have the static IP address set up. The phone system is working, but is experiencing static on the lines – Empire Access has been notified. The internet has not been switched over as IT is working on setting up the proper connections.

The station display screens are up and running. IamResponding is working, showing the people who are responding to the calls. The Keystone dispatch information (MDT) is still having troubles connecting with the county. Our IT, Keystone, and the County IT departments are working to resolve.
